SHOULD MY CHILD STAY HOME FROM SCHOOL?

5 SYMPTOMS TO GIVE YOU CLUES





A NOTE FROM THE SICKBAY:

Please do not send your child to school if they are sick or feeling unwell.

Our Sickbay facilities are to allow provision of basic first aid care only.

The sickbay is not for long term use and in most cases, <u>parents are</u> <u>contacted to collect their children and take them home when</u> their child is unwell.

First Aid F.A.Q.

Last night my child was vomiting/has diarrhoea. (Gastroenteritis or gastro like symptoms.) Can I send them to school?

Keep your child away from other children as much as possible until the vomiting or diarrhoea has stopped. Make sure they are consuming adequate fluids. Your child should be excluded from school until the vomiting or diarrhoea has stopped. (usually 48 hrs)

Last night my child was vomiting. Can I send them to school?

Keep your child at home until at least 24 hours from the last time they vomited. (1 day) We do not have a nurse on duty in sick bay and you will be called to collect your child if they are unwell.

Covid-19 or Flu like symptoms

The symptoms to watch out for are:

- loss or change in sense of smell or taste
- fever (temperature)
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose

Please do not send your child to school if they are experiencing any of these symptoms.

Get tested and stay at home if you or your child feels unwell.
